An exciting initiative, great cooperation, a new trip

What a lovely place to study, to meet, to work, to experience the beauty of Campania. All participants of the study trip for Classics teachers in May 2016 will agree, no doubt. This trip was specially designed for Classics teachers and an attempt to inspire potential new study guides for the future.

The Foundation SAVV wants to inform you now about the future of the Villa Vergiliana. The future of the Villa as a study centre is far from certain. Occupancy grade of the Villa showed a decrease, mainly due to changing economic conditions. Prof. Richard Thomas, President of the Vergilian Society of America and Léon Herrman started a campaign to inform Classics teachers in Europe about the study centre. An information brochure about the Villa found, ‘per cursum electronicum’, its way to numerous schools in Europe. The Vergilian Society of America agreed with a one time travel grant of 13.000 dollars from the Harry Wilks Foundation, to be used for the study trip May 2016.

Almost 25 teachers from the Netherlands, Belgium and the United Kingdom applied enthusiastically. Be led by Léon Herrman and Merel Somhorst, they participated in a programme full of workshops, assignments, sight visits and activities in an attempt to create an inspiring atmosphere. The support and help of three alumni during this trip was highly valued by all participants and we thank the SAVV to fund most of their travel costs. We hope the participating teachers will come back once with their own school party of Vergilian enthusiasts. Needless to say, the SAVV is very happy with this successful initiative.

Then I live.



Recepe from the Villa

*The opinion of Biaggio about
Minestrone!*

Ingredients (4 persons):

1 big potato and 1 zucchini/courgette
1 big carrot, 1 celery stalk and 1 red onion
1/2 lb (230 gr) cabbage and 4 tbs tomato paste
1/4 lb (115 gr.) cooked beans
1 vegetable stock cube and 4 1/2 cup (1 ltr) water
grated Pecorino or Parmesan, olive oil and salt



Minestrone di Verdure

Even when it looks as if this time summer won't come to an end, autumn is not far away.

Time to boost your health with this delicious minestrone from Campania!

The ingredients are an approximation, use whatever leftover veggies you have!

Cut the vegetables into irregular pieces, add a glug of olive oil to a sauce pan and lightly brown the onion. In with the tomato paste/sauce, fry lightly. Then add the rest of the vegetables, a vegetable stock cube and water. Simmer until the vegetables are cooked, add the beans, salt and more water if needed. Let it stand for ten minutes, serve with a hearty dusting of grated cheese and enjoy!
